Schools Out Summer Program

Position Summary

The Child and Youth Worker is a valued member of the RESET Youth team, supporting the delivery of the Schools Out Summer program in partnership with the United Way British Columbia Schools Out Summer Initiative. This initiative is designed to support children and families by providing safe, engaging, and enriching summer programming that promotes learning, connection, and well-being.

Working as part of a collaborative team, the Child and Youth Worker will facilitate group-based programming for children ages 9–12 at a Richmond elementary school, four days per week. The program focuses on fostering social-emotional development, building life skills, and creating positive summer experiences that support a successful transition back to school.

Key Responsibilities

- Plan, prepare, and facilitate inclusive group activities that support social-emotional learning (e.g., communication, conflict resolution, problem-solving, teamwork)
- Co-create programming with children and youth, encouraging their voice, choice, and leadership in activities
- Develop and implement short-term, strengths-based intervention strategies within program guidelines, in collaboration with the team
- Foster a welcoming, culturally responsive, and trauma-informed environment where all participants feel safe, respected, and included
- Build positive, trusting relationships with children and youth, including those who may be experiencing vulnerability
- Encourage participation and engagement in recreational, educational, and skill-building activities
- Maintain accurate records, statistics, and required documentation, and provide updates to the Program Director
- Collaborate effectively as part of a Child and Youth Care team in a structured program setting



Supervision

- Day-to-day on-site support and guidance from program staff
- Ongoing supervision with the Program Director

Training

- On-the-job training provided through mentorship, observation, and team collaboration

Qualifications

Eligibility Requirements

- **Must be 30 years of age or younger (Service Canada requirement)**
- Legally entitled to work in Canada (Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person with refugee protection under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*)

Core Qualifications

- Post-secondary education (completed or in progress) in Child and Youth Care, Social Work, Psychology, Education, or a related field is preferred
- Experience working with children and/or youth in group settings
- Demonstrated understanding of inclusive, trauma-informed, and strengths-based approaches
- Ability to successfully complete a Criminal Record Check for working with vulnerable populations

Additional Requirements

- Valid Class 5 BC Driver's License (no restrictions) - **MANDATORY**

Assets

- Access to a personal vehicle with business insurance and minimum \$2 million liability
- Current First Aid and CPR certification



Hours and Compensation

- 35 hours per week, Monday to Thursday (daytime hours)
- This is a full-time, 8-week summer position, and availability for the full duration of the program is required
